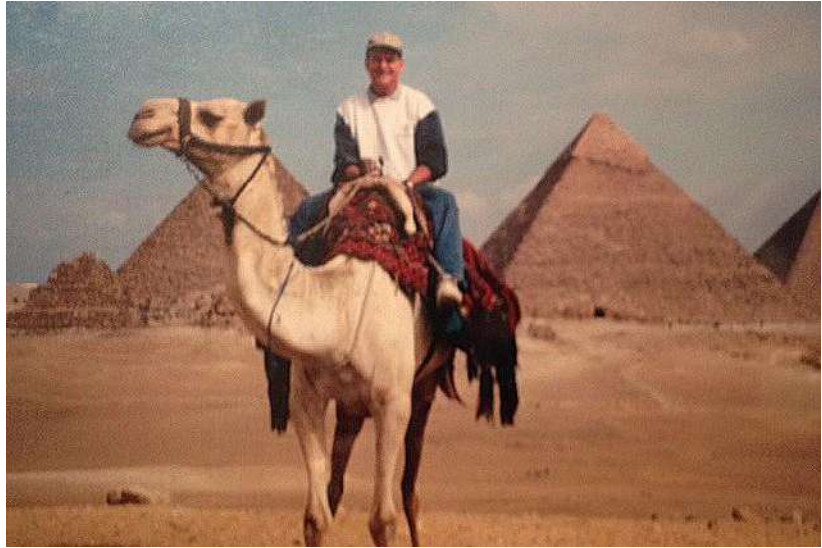

A Very Unusual Career



Col Dick Solt

Colonel Richard Solt graduated in 1960 from Penn State ROTC as 2LT. During Cuban Missile Crisis, he was assigned to Incirlik, Turkey. He was then assigned to HQ Tactical Air Command with rapid deployments worldwide and chemical biological school at Dugway, Utah. Then on to Vietnam in 1968 during both TET Offenses, followed by a directed assignment to HQ PACAF to follow up on Vietnam projects. Following that he was assigned to Kelly AFB, to start career in Foreign Military Sales, working with Northrop Aircraft to put over 1500 F-5 fighter aircraft into worldwide foreign air forces. He then went to CINCPAC HQ in Hawaii to assist with preparation for Senate and Congressional Hearings in Washington. He then was assigned to the Pentagon in the Secretary of Defense Office followed by Division Chief on the Air Staff in International Programs, supporting countries in the Americas involved with the Contra War. His final assignment was Commander of Foreign Military Training. In retirement he went to Saudi Arabia working in the Royal Saudi Air Force HQ during Desert Storm, and then hired by Boeing HQ office as Director for delivery and support of 72 F15S aircraft. Col Solt will talk about the four events he was involved with - Cuban Missile Crisis, Vietnam, Contra Affair and Desert Storm.

NWFMOA President Fran Hendricks Addresses Tyndall AFB Civil Engineers

Fran Hendricks was invited to address the Air Force's newest Civil Engineers Course at Tyndall AFB on June 1, 2025. This course is to prepare the new AF Civil Engineer Officers for what awaits them at their base of assignment and deployed locations.



MOAA Foundation Awards NWFMOA Grant

The NWFMOA was recently notified it was approved to receive a \$3,250 MOAA Foundation grant for its Annual Commissary Gift Card Program that assists Junior Enlisted Families in need. This marks the sixth consecutive year we have received a grant for this community outreach initiative.

Last year, we were awarded a \$3,000 MOAA Foundation grant and we raised an additional \$7,000 for a total of \$10,000 which allowed us to directly impact 400 families during the Holidays with \$25 Commissary Gift Cards. Working with First Sergeants from Eglin, Hurlburt, Camp Bull Simons, and Duke Field, the cards were distributed to those deemed in most need. Each gift card was accompanied by a letter from the President, NWFMOA that described the program and listed the donors who made the program possible. Debriefs from the First Sergeant after distribution indicated the great appreciation and emotion of receiving a Commissary Gift Card.

Our goal for 2025 is to initially match the \$3,250 grant through community donations and then strive to surpass last year's total. If we can raise a grand total of \$11,000, we will be able to support 440 junior enlisted families in need. That is 40 more families than we reached last year.

To reach our goal, we invite you to participate. Donations can be made by check or cash and given to any Chapter Board Member. Donations can also be made with a credit card on our website. We welcome the opportunity to add you to our banner of donors (displayed on our website with a minimum donation of \$25). Additionally, we encourage you to participate in our monthly Chapter luncheon 50/50...all proceeds go to support this community outreach program.

Bottomline; every \$25 we raise will directly impact one junior enlisted family in need. Thank you!

Legislative Corner



For the Legislative Minute at our June monthly meeting, I highlighted a 2023 Government Accountability Office (GAO) report that revealed alarming conditions in unaccompanied military housing, including mold, broken heating and air conditioning systems, sewage overflows, and pest infestations. While recent National Defense Authorization Acts (NDAA) have added oversight, more action is needed to ensure full transparency and accountability. MOAA is urging Congress to require DoD to publicly disclose housing conditions reports and expand housing complaint databases to allow servicemembers to submit photos and videos as evidence. Lawmakers must take immediate action to improve the living conditions of those who serve.

I invite you to visit the NWFMOA Webpage and hit the “MOAA Take Action” button. That will take you to the MOAA’s Active Legislative Campaigns. There you will find all the legislative actions MOAA is working, along with this specific action. With a few clicks, a letter voicing your support will be sent to our two Senators and Representative. Thank you for taking the time to make this happen.
