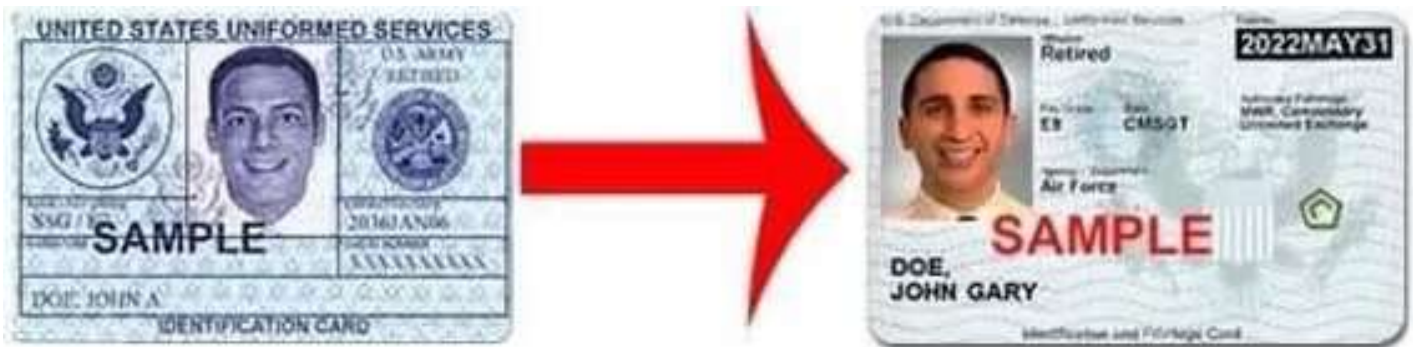

# Call to Action 25-01

## Replace Your Military ID Card

If you haven't changed your and your spouse's military ID to the new Next Generation Uniformed Services Identification (USID) card, you need to do so before December 31, 2025. If you miss this deadline, the Security Forces will confiscate your military ID upon trying to enter the base.

How do you know if you have the correct military ID card? The new Next Generation Uniformed Services Identification (USID) card is white. The soon to be outdated cards are red, brown, green, blue, and tan in color. It doesn't matter if your current military ID card says INDEF or has an expiration date beyond December 31, 2025. If your military ID card is not the new white ID card, it will be confiscated. See below.



Both you and your spouse can get your new Next Generation Uniformed Services Identification (USID) card by visiting the Eglin Military Personnel Section, Building 210 (310 Van Matre Avenue). Appointments are not required. Search military ID cards Eglin AFB online for instructions on how to sign into the queue before arriving, thereby shortening your wait time.

# Chaplain's Corner

## Army Chaplains Mark 250 Years of Ministering to Soldiers

The Army recently celebrated its 250th birthday — two and a half centuries of defending the nation since standing up, June 14, 1775. Not long after, on July 29, 1775, the Army Chaplain Corps was established to provide ministerial support to those soldiers.



The painting "*The Chaplain at Valley Forge*," by artist William A. Smith, depicts Gen. George Washington, his chaplain and soldiers praying at Valley Forge during the Revolutionary War.

"The members of today's Army Chaplain Corps are sustaining and enriching a sacred legacy, which our predecessors began building even before our nation was founded in 1776," said Army Chaplain (Maj. Gen.) William Green Jr., the 26th Army chief of chaplains. "Gen. George Washington requested that chaplains be added to the Army to meet soldiers' religious and spiritual needs, and to support good morals and morale."

At the request of Washington, the Continental Congress authorized one chaplain for each regular regiment of the Continental Army, Green said, adding that many of the militia regiments that served alongside those in the Continental Army also had chaplains.

Today, he said, the role of the Army Chaplain Corps remains as important as it was 250 years ago. The Chaplain Corps has evolved to include more than 3,000 chaplains, nearly 3,000 religious affairs specialists, more than 500 chaplain candidates and more than 50 directors of religious education across the regular Army, Army Reserve

and Army National Guard. They continue to provide important religious support and advice on spiritual matters to soldiers of all ranks.

"Our U.S. Army Chaplain Corps is the most multifaceted and capable chaplaincy in history, and we will remain so, to support our Army's preparations to win during multidomain and large-scale combat operations in the years ahead," Green said. "Our corps is a unique branch of the total Army that remains a necessary, critical contributor to our nation's success on the battlefields of the future, just as it was on the battlefields during our nation's war for independence."

## **“A Memory or Two”**

I signed in at my first unit in September of 1988. There was only enough time to draw your gear and go to the field. Most of my first 10 years was spent going to and coming from training that would last from a few days to 6 weeks or more. I would go on to be gone from family for 3 to 3 1/2 years training and deployments.

My first exercise I was in the tent with the Battalion Commander and Sergeant Major. I did know how to salute and had already been in Command and Staff meetings. Little did I know that I would be flying with the Commander to various sites over a 3 state area. It was a little pressure for a 1LT. We would land and I would try to visit with every Soldier.

This Signal was not authorized a Chaplain but I was assigned there out of necessity. The OPT TEMPO was very fast paced. Half of the unit supported 1 of the 2 brigades keeping them very busy. It was hard to keep up with the training schedule and find my Soldiers. It didn't take long for them to find out they had a Chaplain. The Commander had me in the right place and very visible.

When I could not fly with the Commander, I took his vehicle and driver and went to other training sites. We came up the hill, rather steep, and oh the reaction on the ground with the Commander came driving up unannounced. All they could see was the bumper number. What a relieve when they saw just the Chaplain.

Every night the Commander and Command Sergeant Major would discuss and ask for input in taking care of many Soldier problems. It was a challenge. I was in a unique situation all of my career. I saw the Battalion from the top down from my position as an officer and from the bottom up as a Chaplain who was with them when and where they went. I knew when the stress was coming and where it hit the hardest. This made it easy to plan a ministry of presence showing availability and do all kinds of classes. The sooner I knew about the problem(s) in a unit, life or family, the easier it was to help. No miracle needed. Just someone to listen and help them understand what needs to be done to solve the problem.

I provided worship or coordinated religious support for all. I also took care of all regardless of differing faith. My 1st sermon was on a very rainy day. I found a tent to used temporarily. Put the word out. This 1st service, I was out of the rain but standing in about 10 inches of water. Proper gear and no problem. I did services for 1 or 100. I walked from fighting position to position and offered the 2 minute sermon. Sometimes, I would let them preach to themselves. Those were always interesting.

I made it through the 2 week deployment and was able to witness some great training. The black hawk caught a downdraft coming over a mountain and dropped a few feet. What felt like fun at first was changed when I hear the reaction of pilot and co-pilot over the head set.

I had some great experiences and became trusted part of the Command Staff. I have recently been in touch with that 1st Battalion Commander after 37 years.

A little humor. I pinned on captain a few months after coming to the unit. A few asked, “how did you make rank so fast?” My reply, “I am that good!”

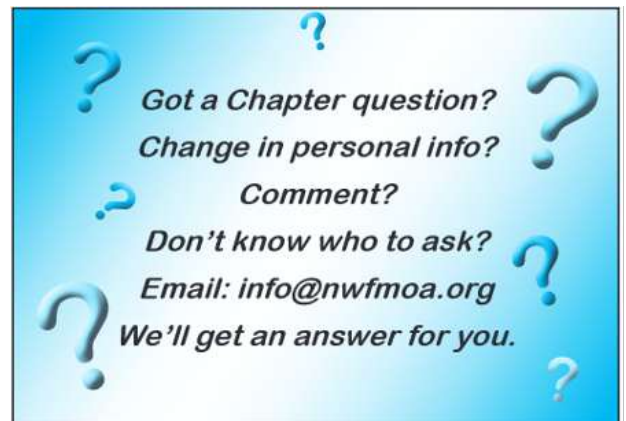

## **NWFMOA member Col. Dale Marks receives ‘Quilt of Valor’**

Retired Colonel Dale Marks received a Quilt of Valor Heirloom quilt Thursday, July 10, presented by the Flying Needles Quilt Guild of Valparaiso. Marks currently serves as Assistant Secretary of Defense for Energy, Installations, and Environment, where he advises on Department of Defense matters relating to energy, installations, and the environment. He oversees the department’s extensive real property assets, including millions of acres of land and more than 500,000 buildings and structures at over 800 installations.

Previously, Marks served as Executive Director of the 96th Test Wing at Eglin Air Force Base, directing a workforce of over 10,000 military, civilian, and contractor personnel. His role included leading developmental testing and evaluation of advanced weapon systems and directing base operating support for the Air Force’s largest installation.

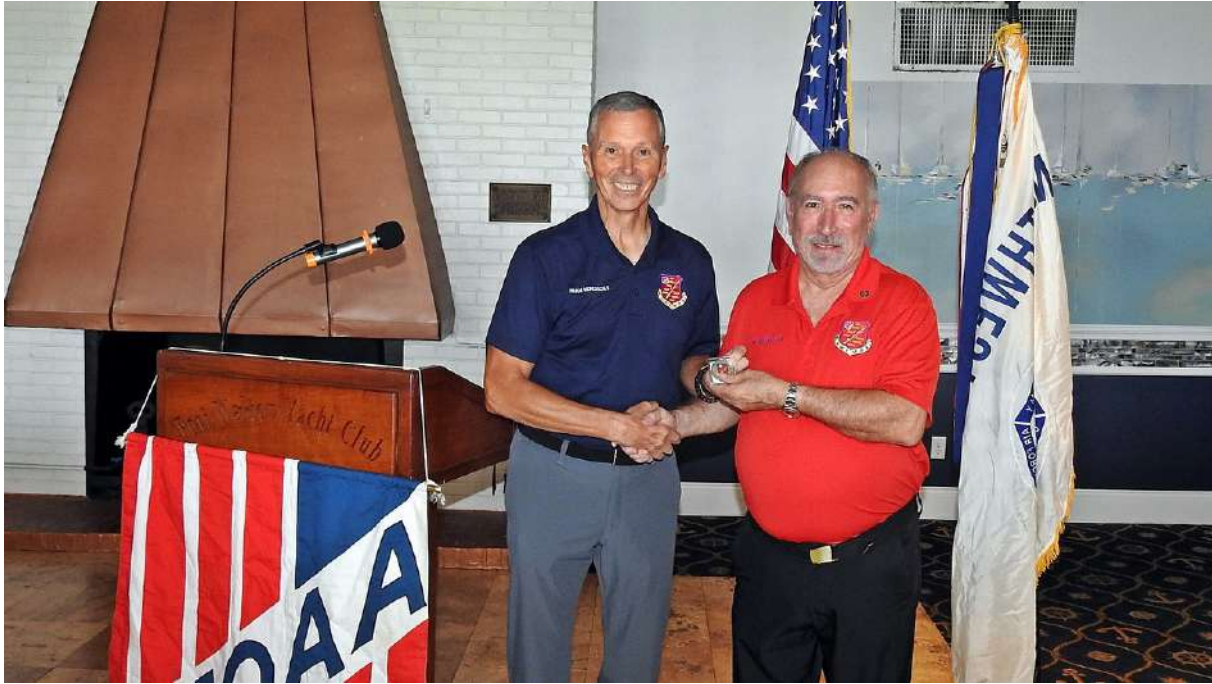
His military career spanned over 24 years of both Active Duty and National Guard service in the U.S. Air Force. As a combat fighter pilot, Marks logged over 3,000 hours in A-10, F-15E, AT-38, and F-16 aircraft. His service included a deployment as Chief of Staff for Operational Sustainment in Kabul with U.S. Forces – Afghanistan and NATO Resolute Support.

The Flying Needles Quilt Guild’s activities include creating quilts for charity projects, completing Quilts of Valor for military veterans, and working on “Opportunity Quilts” for fundraising.

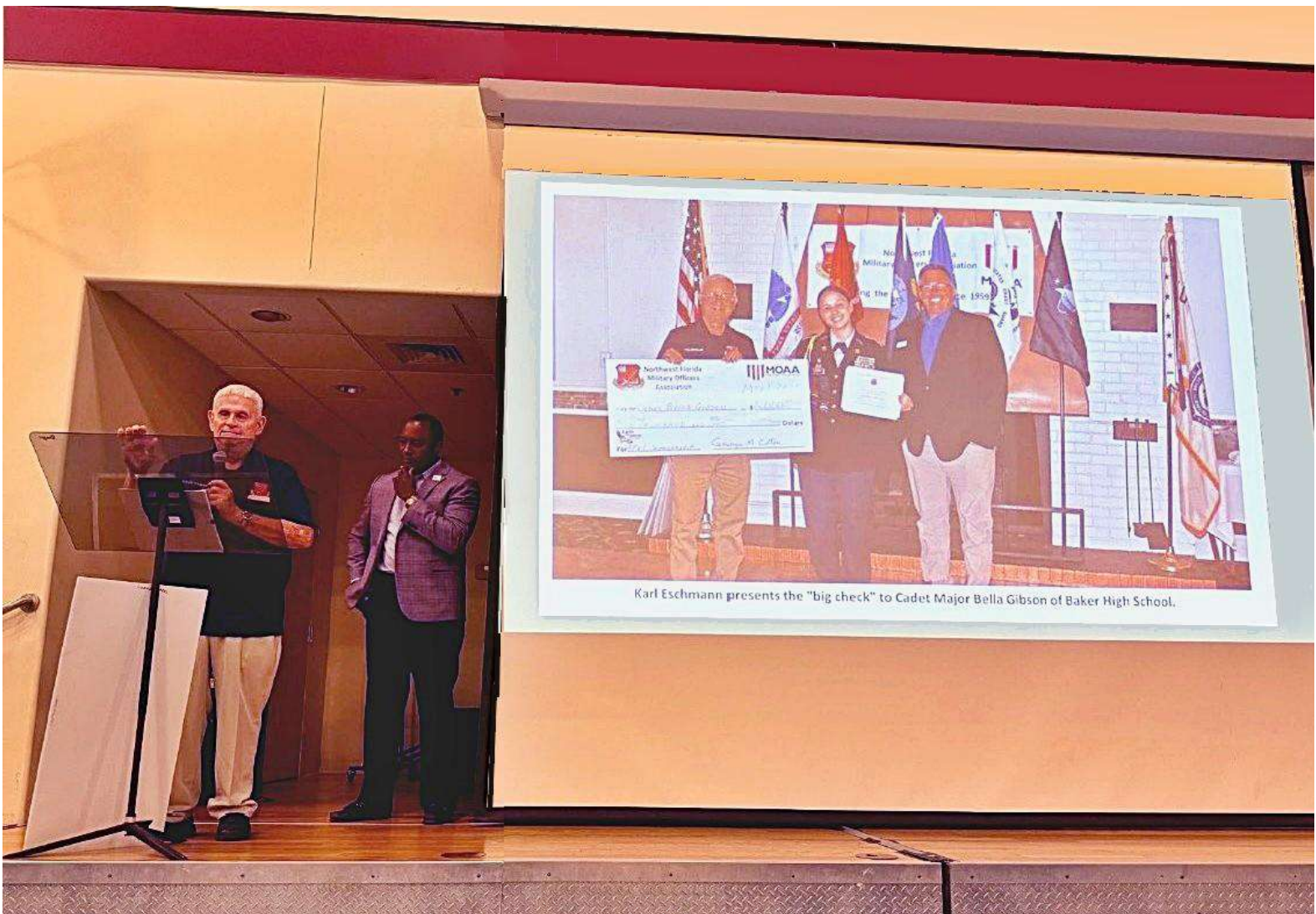


# Scholarship Fund

# Legislative Corner



## Legislative Corner...MOAA's Summer Advocacy in Action Campaign

At our August meeting, I shared excerpts from an email I received from General Kelly, MOAA President and CEO. The entire email I received follows.

### President's Message: Support Servicemembers during Summer Advocacy in Action

General Hendricks,

Lawmakers are returning to their home states for summer recess, a time they will use to connect directly with their constituents at public events and meetings. This is an important opportunity to remind them that **caring for servicemembers, past and present—and their families—requires support at every stage of service.**

As you may recall, MOAA brought several key issues to Capitol Hill during the spring. Your actions on these issues made a real difference. You turned out in numbers in support of improving unaccompanied housing across military bases – and recent legislation secured over \$1 billion dedicated to enhancing these facilities.

Since Spring, several other MOAA supported initiatives have garnered interest and momentum among lawmakers. For this year's Summer Advocacy in Action Campaign, we are capitalizing on this momentum by focusing on the following topics:

- **Major Richard Star Act** – Combat-injured veterans deserve their full earned compensation, and this legislation reinforces our promise to support those who served — long after they've left active duty. The Star Act is an enduring priority for MOAA, and we are excited to report it has generated significant momentum since Spring. We are sharpening our focus and targeting our efforts to drive this initiative even further.
- **TRICARE Access to Care** – Servicemembers and military families can often face administrative barriers and red-tape their counterparts covered by civilian health plans do not when it comes to reproductive health. By strengthening access to care, we can improve mission readiness and boost retention across the all-volunteer force.
- **Military Spouse Hiring Act** – Spouse employment is a critical component for the financial stability of military families and adding military spouses to the Work Opportunity Tax Credit will incentivize more businesses to hire military spouses.
